

# Wildlings Resort FAQ

## How do we get there?

### Google Maps

The easiest way to get directions is to enter Surrey Lake as your destination into your google maps. Make sure your destination is Surrey Lake, Thompson-Nicola. There are other Surrey Lakes in the province.

### From the Coquihalla

Take the Lac Le Jeune/Logan Lake exit ( 30 mins north of Merrit or 30 mins south of Kamloops), follow the signs west toward Logan Lake. You are now on the 97D also known as Meadow Creek Rd. Approximately 7km after the exit you will find Surrey-Lake Road on your left. Follow this road for another 9km and you'll be here!

### From Ashcroft

Follow the signs for Logan Lake onto the 97C. Once you have passed through Logan Lake Township, you are now on the 97D also known as Meadow Creek Rd. Approximately 16km after the town you will find Surrey-Lake Road on your right. Follow this road for another 9km and you'll be here!

## What do I need to bring?

Don't forget that this is a wilderness area, please bring sturdy outdoor footwear and clothing appropriate for a high alpine pass. The camp goes dark at 10 pm so you'll need to bring a headlamp or flashlight to navigate after this time. As we are off the grid, there will be no refrigerators available at this time so please bring your food in a cooler with ice. Showers and a washroom are provided, however, you'll need to bring your own hygiene products and a towel. Bug spray and citronella candles are a good idea to keep any bugs a bay.

## Cabin Guests

Firewood, cookware, and axes are provided. Unless you have booked one of the cabins where bedding is provided or you have arranged to have bedding added to your booking, you will need to bring a pillow and a sleeping bag or sheets and a duvet.

## Tent/RV Campers

Firewood is available to burn in your fire ring ( provided there are no fire bans), you will need to bring your own axe to make kindling though. You will need a tent and sleeping gear capable of keeping you warm for the conditions during your stay. Cookware is not provided for tent/RV guests, so you'll need to make sure you bring that along also.

## Do you have boats for rent?

Yes, we have a fleet of aluminum boats with outboard motors for rent. Please contact us prior to your stay to check availability and reserve.

We are also adding a fleet of paddleboards, so check in with us on this.

## Does the resort have electricity?

While we plan to eventually have full-time service to all of our cabins and washrooms, currently most of them are serviced by a 20 kW generator. The generator runs from 7:30 am until 10:00 am then again from 6:00 pm until 10:00 pm. Outside of this time the cabins and washrooms will have no power. Battery operated lamps are situated in each building. Guests are expected to bring their own flashlight or headlamp to move safely about the grounds after dark.

## Are there fish in the lake?

Yes, the lake is stocked annually with rainbow trout. While most of the fish in Surrey Lake are of the smaller variety, you'll have plenty of action. For those looking for more of a fight our neighbouring lakes still have some trophies. Don't forget your BC freshwater fishing license!

## Can we have outdoor fires?

Yes provided we are not in a fire ban. Please read our policies section information on fire regulations at Wildings Resort.

## Why is the camp smoke-free?

We have children and many of our guests have children, we care about their well being. Furthermore, BC has seen an increase in wildfires caused by human activity and cigarette butts are one of the leading causes. We don't want to put anyone at an increased risk of fire.

## Can we have visitors while we stay?

Guests can entertain visitors during their stay, visitors need to be registered using the day use registration portal found on the website and a fee of \$15.00 per visitor vehicle is payable. (\$20.00 for those with boat trailers)

## Can we bring our pets?

Yes provided you have registered your pet using the pet registration portal on our website and have read our policies pertaining to pets (also found on the website)

## Can we bring firearms or bows?

Hunters and Shooters are very welcome at the resort so you are welcome to bring your firearms and bows. However, for safety reasons, there is **no shooting of any type on the resort** grounds, this includes rifles, shotguns, pellet or bb guns, slingshots, bows or crossbows. There are areas near the resort where it is legal to shoot, however, it should be noted that it is illegal to shoot a single projectile within 400m of the Coquihalla highway. Hunters/shooters are at all times responsible for maintaining safe shooting practices, including being fully aware of the trajectory of their projectile. **Firearms on the property must be unloaded at all times** and stored in accordance with the Canadian Firearms act.

## Is the water drinkable?

The well water has been tested in accordance with the Interior Health regulations and is safe to drink. Those wishing to be extra careful should boil their water first.
